Essential Student Learning Items

Items for which parents/carers pay to the College to provide or may provide themselves, if appropriate. These items are essential to support instruction in the standard curriculum program.

Year level materials and services

Charge covers the cost of resource materials, College handbooks, locks, additional photocopying and stationery, travel and entrance costs to **whole** school sporting events, activities programs and additional curriculum resources.

Subject materials

Additional resources booklets specifically created and collated to enhance student learning in each subject. Additional consumable materials associated with high cost Art and Technology subjects, such as paints, canvases, materials for items made and kept and food ingredients.

Student technical support

The student technical support item provides funding for additional technical support required to maintain all student computers (including but not limited to access to College network and student drives, Koonung SC email, software support, warranty and insurance processing) and other ICT/e-learning equipment (including but not limited to student photocopiers, data projectors, interactive whiteboards and specialised media equipment) and resources throughout the College.

Student wellbeing and programs

- Oversee all health for injuries, enrolments, excursions and camps including consultation with staff, parents, students and camp/excursion organisation
- Oversee health and wellbeing of all students attending the health centre
- Oversee and coordinate health centre including equipment and storing of medicines
- Support curriculum and community programs at the College (for example – Live Life, Drug Information sessions)
- Provide counselling, support and mediation for students and their families, including behaviour management plans, social and organisational skills
- Consulting with external agencies for additional student support programs
- Provide support to teaching staff to assist students with learning behaviours.

Optional Items

These are items provided in addition to the standard curriculum program, and are offered to all students.

Co-curricular activities

Activities associated with the curriculum such as the instrumental music program, competitions, camps and excursions that are provided on a user-pays basis. If parents/carers choose to access them for students, they will be required to pay for them.
